FROM ANGER TO ACTION.

Around mid-day on Friday 3rd April parents in Maryhill area, angry at Glasgow City Council's attempt to close 25 primary schools and nurseries, occupied two schools adjacent each other, Wyndford Primary and St. Gregory's Primary, the occupations continue. An originally tense situation with police has been resolved through negotiation, and the peaceful protests are being allowed to continue unharmed. In support of the local parents action a well attended rally was held outside both schools at 12 noon on Saturday 4th April.

Why have the parents taken such action, I doubt if it is because they don't want to sleep in their own homes. It is simply that they are pissed off with a council that doesn't listen to the voices of those who elected them, the parents have had enough of a council that ignores the people that they are supposed to serve.

In this particular area, if the schools go the area becomes a desert with no facilities for the kids, no place for after school activities, the council does not have a mandate to inflict this type of environment on anybody.

The parents who are occupying the schools need your support, it is only by mass support of the local people that this battle can be won, it is your communities, your schools, take control, show solidarity and stop the closures, demand improvement of the local schools not their closure. If they want to save money don't let it be our kids and our communities that have to take the hit. What these parents are doing is showing a model for all the other areas to follow. Mass direct action is the only road left when an authority starts to bulldoze you in a direction you don't want to go.

A WASTE OF SPACE AND TIME??

Scotland is a relatively small country and it doesn't have a lot of people, but I suppose we produce our fair share of waste and by rights we should be responsible for its disposal. However what is surprising is that last year approximately 184,000 tonnes of waste arrived here from outside Scotland for us to dispose of, mainly from England (app. 70,000 tonnes) and Northern Ireland. Approximately 94,000 tonnes went into Scottish landfill sites.

This waste contains anything from contaminated soil, polluted dredgings, chemical/industrial waste to asbestos. Over 9,000 tonnes of this waste were disposed of in the Glasgow and Clyde Valley area.

In waste disposal there is supposed to be the "principle of proximity" meaning that the waste should

be disposed of as near the source of its production as possible. Shipping it across the Irish Sea doesn't seem to fit this principle. Of the 9,000 tonnes from outside Scotland disposed of in the Glasgow area, it is difficult to see how this fits in with the principle.

When ever I read these sort of facts I get a sneaking suspicion that money and big business is at the heart of it all. Landfill charges are lower in Scotland than in England. What ever the cost of disposal it is wrong to ship what can be very dangerous waste over long distances, accidents do happen. It would be interesting to see how much waste is shipped from Scotland into England

Of course these sort of figures are kept quiet, the public don't need to know, after all it might be your neighbourhood that it is passing through and it might be getting dumped near you and you might complain.

DEATH AT THE HANDS OF THE STATE.

December 2008 in Athens a youth is shot dead by Greek police, this brutal act was the catalyst for the release of a wave of pent up anger and frustration of the Greek people, a wave that washed over Greece and many European cities for well over a month. April 2009 an innocent man walking home from his work in London is brutally assaulted and dies, again it is the hand of the police that is blood stained. Anybody who has been to demonstrations on a regular basis knows that the police are not there to keep the peace nor to enforce the law, their action is always provocative and intimidating. They are agents of the system and are there to stifle protest. The history of protest is written in the blood of ordinary people, blood shed by the various agents of the system. Each death causes shock among the ordinary people but our history is littered with such events. Who remembers Blair Peach? April 1979, he was clubbed on the head at a demonstration in London and died the next day, no charges were ever brought against the police officer responsible. Death by misadventure was the verdict.

It is time that the ordinary people woke up to the fact that the state kills workers who fight for a better life. Here in Glasgow we can go back as far as you want and the story is the same. 1787 Calton weavers strike, the strikers marched towards the Cathedral to make their point in a demand for a living wage, the military opened fire and killed 6 wounding many more. Jump forward to 1919 when workers were asking for a 40 hour week to try to soak up unemployment. They were baton charged in George Square and running battles ensued throughout the city the military with fixed bayonets were posted on the city streets, machine guns on the roofs at George Square and tanks stationed off the Saltmarket. Remember the brutal treatment hand out to the miners in the eighties? Our history is littered with such cases, struggle to improve your life and risk the wrath of the state, it's there to protect the wealth of that army of parasites that feed off our backs. Until we build a mass grassroots movement to replace the system of profit and exploitation, and to protect us from the ravishes of such a system we will continue to suffer at their hands.

LOCAL SCHOOLS FOR LOCAL COMMUNITIES SEGREGATION OR CO-OPERATION??

There is rightly anger across Glasgow as the City Council 'consults' on proposals to close another 13 primary and 12 nursery schools in order to save £3.7m. The proposals would see some children travelling much further to school and nursery and some areas will be left without a school at all.

As a parent and council tax payer I want to see good quality education delivered locally and accountable to the local community. In saying that, I accept that some schools may need to close. There seems to me to be no sense in keeping open half empty schools when roofs are leaking and many of the so called 'extras' like music lessons are being cut back for lack of funds. However, in drawing up it's proposals, Glasgow City Council seems to have had more important priorities than the needs of the city's children. Well used facilities in West Pollokshields, where land and property values are high, appear have been targeted for closure purely in a desperate grab for cash. Parents will need to take their children 1.5 miles to a replacement facility in Melville Street.

In Maryhill, both non-denominational Wynford and Catholic St Gregory's Primaries are threatened with closure. Parents are calling for the two schools to be merged. They can see clearly the nonsense of closing both and bussing the children to non-denominational and Catholic schools outside the area. The institutional segregation of education in Glasgow is the elephant in the corner of the room that politicians, particularly those in the Labour party, are unwilling to acknowledge. It is wasteful, perpetuates bigotry and is undermining the provision of local schools for local communities.

We need to support those parents and communities seeking to keep schools and nurseries in their communities and grasp the opportunity to end apartheid in education in Glasgow for all our sakes. **CL.**

It has recently been announced that the 6 big energy companies intend creating a new company to oversee the installation of 46 million new "smart" meters.
