CREDIT CRISIS AND FEAR IN THE MARKET!!!

The headlines shout at you, "FEAR GRIPS THE MARKETS" what exactly are they talking about? Who's fear and what are they afraid of? Well it seems to be the fear of all those sweaty palmed greedy little billionaires, they are afraid that their billions will shrink to millions and they are trying to grab their loot and hide it somewhere until it is safe to bring it out and start to screw us again.

Governments always waffle about how they are trying to help the people but there is nothing like fat cat capitalist parasites squealing, for the government to show its true priorities. To organise different types of co-operatives within our communities, and other forms of working class mutual aid schemes, defend those facing foreclosures. LOCAL GOVERNMENT WORKERS STRIKE OVER PAY CUTS

Local government workers in Scotland took strike action on 20 August and 24 September as part of their campaign for a fair pay offer from the employers. Many local government workers are carrying out essential jobs for low wages so union members were angered by a pay offer of 2.5% when inflation is running at 5%. They rightly felt that they were being offered a pay cut and support for the strikes was solid and widespread.

The employers claim that times are difficult and money for public services tight. This is a nonsensical argument! When economic conditions were “better” did the government make more money available to end low pay in local government? No, they repaid national debt, built the millennium dome and started a couple of wars. Why should we now accept their claims they can't pay a fair wage increase?

The other bogus claim made by government bosses is that to pay reasonable wage increases in the public sector would fuel inflation. Over recent years public sector pay rises have been at an annual rate of around 2%, the rate of inflation or less; whilst private sector pay rises over the last year have run at 3.8%. World commodity prices are fuelling inflation; but it's convenient to find a scapegoat in striking public sector workers.

Strike action in local government has been suspended to consider a revised pay offer of 3% this year and 2.5% next. There is no mention of any specific proposal offer a greater increase for the lowest paid. Chief executives will get the same rate of pay increase as those barely above the minimum wage. This offer was made immediately before a widespread programme of selective strike action was to start. We are in a position of strength, the danger is that the Union bosses will rush to sell us a deal that gives everyone a pay cut in real terms and does nothing to address the disgrace of low pay. **Local Government Worker**

DOORS OPEN AT GOVANHILL BATHS

On Sunday 21 September over 900 people queued for up to an hour to be given tours of the Edwardian baroque style baths building as part of the annual Doors Open Day.

The closure of the much loved facility by Glasgow City Council in 2001 caused much anger in the local community. An occupation of the building followed which led to the violent eviction of the occupation by the Council, Sheriff Officers and Police, which was seen on TV screens around the world.

This mass direct action by members of the local community has demonstrated the strength of this type of action. After spending what must total hundreds of thousands of pounds of our money to keep the community out of this building, the Council has now agreed to give the building to the Govanhill Baths Trust, which is on track to re-open the Baths in 2011.

A victory for the power of the collective action of ordinary people. The challenge now is to ensure that the management of the Baths Trust is transparent, democratic, accountable and responsive to the community it serves. **CL.**

ONE OF THE WORLD'S RICHEST COUNTRIES??

Though it is obvious the the people don't enjoy those riches. According to a recent survey the UK offers among the lowest quality of life in Europe despite residents earning the highest incomes, We are among the highest price of fuel and other essential goods, while below average spending on health and education, short holidays and late retirement place the UK just above Ireland at the bottom of the uSwitch.com European quality of life index.

Although British families earn more than £10,000 more than the European average, they pay the highest prices for diesel, 18% above the average, and the second highest price for unleaded petrol, 6% more than average. They also pay 49% more for gas and 5% more for electricity - the third highest prices in Europe.

UK spending on healthcare and education is below the European average while life expectancy is the third lowest at 78.9 years, compared to 80.9 in France or 80.7 in Sweden.

Workers have the third highest retirement age and suffer the shortest holiday entitlement - a week below average, according to the study. A total of 41,026 residents left the UK in 2006, the highest number in Europe, with total emigration increasing by 30% from the UK since 2001.

The study assessed 19 factors to rank the UK in relation to nine other major countries across Europe. Spain offers the best quality of life in Europe, despite families earning an annual net income of just £16,789 - £8,500 below the average and less than half that of the UK. Spain enjoys low taxation, cheaper essential goods, higher than average life expectancy and a generous holiday allowance, uSwitch said. France came second, boasting the second highest spend on healthcare and the highest holiday allowance at 40 days.
